#### What is Sports Premium Funding?

### **Sport at Samuel White's Infant School**

Sport and Physical exercise play a big part in the life of our school. It is an important part of the school curriculum and a key part of the school's extracurricular programme. The school promotes sport to keep children active and healthy, foster teamwork, provide opportunities for fair competition, and support physical and emotional development and to have fun.

The Sports Premium Funding is used to develop the teaching of PE and games in the school curriculum, increase the range of extra-curricular activity and to develop increased opportunities for inter and intra school competition.
