What is Sports Premium Funding?

This is targeted money provided by the government to develop sport in schools. We welcome this funding and we are using it to improve our sporting offer to all the children.

Sport at Hanham Abbots Junior School

Sport and Physical exercise play a big part in the life of our school. It is an important part of the school curriculum and a key part of the school's extracurricular programme. The school promotes sport to keep children active and healthy, foster teamwork, provide opportunities for fair competition, support physical and emotional development and to have fun.

The Sports Premium Funding is used to develop the teaching of PE and games in the school curriculum, increase the range of extra-curricular activity and to develop increased opportunities for inter and intra school competition.

An interactive sports day was set up by PS, involving both those children in school and at home.

Holiday club provision for key worker children		Opportunities for children to represent the school and develop confidence as athletes. These opportunities were practical and in person terms 1-3 and virtual from Term 4.
		A virtual sports day was arranged and delivered by PG. This enabled all children to access whether at home or school during periods of partial opening. Children at Samuel Whites Infant School also took part in this event.

C. Membership of the CSET Sports Partnership	£3,456	This provided key support for our PE coordinator including PE Leaders network, access to training for PE and health promoting activities. Access to high quality CPD for staff. Ability to access CSET sports tournaments and competitions in terms 1-3. From March 2020 most of these were held as virtual events – accessible at school and for those based at home for their learning. It made competition possible alongside physical and coordination challenges.
 D. Forest Schools: Skills linked to gross motor Links to healthy lifestyles and outdoor sports skills. 	£2,699	Forest School is very popular with all children and engagement levels are 100%. All HAJ children had the opportunity to take part in outdoor challenges, develop collaborative skills and explore the environment. Pupils had access to a wide range of equipment both fine and gross motor. Pupils learn outdoor activity skills such as orienteering. Pupils are active for whole session.
