What is Sports Premium Funding?

This is targeted money provided by the government to develop sport in schools. We welcome this funding and we are using it to improve our sporting offer to all the children.

Sport at Samuel Whites Infant School

Sport and Physical exercise play a big part in the life of our school. It is an important part of the school day, the curriculum and part of the school's extra-curricular programme. The school invests in physical activity from EYFS to support children's physical development in early childhood. Formal and informal opportunities are woven into the school day to keep children active and healthy, foster teamwork, provide opportunities for fair competition, support physical and emotional development and to have fun.

The Sports Premium Funding is used to develop the teaching of PE and games in the school curriculum, increase the range of extra-curricular activity and to develop increased opportunities for inter and intra school competition.

How much Sports Premium did we get, how did we spend it and what was the impact?

Pupils at Samuel Whites Infants school take part in local sports events as well the South Glos Festival of Sport and football tournaments.
B. Primary partnership is used to provide; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To lead games lessons following the school agreed curriculum. • Lunchtime and after school clubs provision • Support groups for gross motor skills 	£2,292	<p>This provides key support for our PE coordinator including PE Leaders network, access to training for PE and health promoting activities.</p> <p>This also provides access to a range of activities for pupils to participate in. From March 2020 most of these were held as virtual events – accessible at school and for those based at home for their learning. It made competition possible alongside physical and coordination challenges.</p> <p>Pre-Lockdown it provided opportunities for children to experience a range of sports through visitors and taster lessons e.g. tennis, cricket and tag rugby.</p>
B. TA outdoor physical play leader; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fine and gross motor skills developed to ensure rapid progression in the moving and handling ELG in preparation for KS1. • Break times have an additional adult who runs games to develop and consolidate skills. 	£13,566	<p>Our outdoor play leader provides opportunities for our youngest children to participate in both planned and self-initiated activities to develop both gross and fine motor skills.</p> <p>By February half term EYFS children were making very good progress in their physical development.</p>
D. Forest Schools: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skills linked to gross motor • Links to healthy lifestyles and outdoor sports skills. 	£1,672	<p>Forest School is very popular with all children and engagement levels are 100%. Children have the opportunity to take part in outdoor challenges, develop collaborative skills and explore the environment.</p> <p>Pupils had access to a wide range of equipment to develop fine and gross motor skills alongside creative play.</p>
E. Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equipment, including play equipment 	£125	Children have the opportunity to use high quality PE equipment in order to develop skills.
