Reading books

All children will be given a phonically decodable reading book which they should be able to read fluently on their allocated reading day, and we will change them the following week. All books we receive back into school will be quarantined for a minimum time of 5 days. English

To help your child at home with their English this term, you could do the following:

- Read and discuss the poem 'The Magic Box' by Kit Wright.
- Make your own magic box! Talk about the impossible things you would put inside.
- Support your child to draw and label the items inside their magic box.
- Have a go at writing instructions for potion making!
- When practising writing at home support your child to start every sentence with a capital letter, leave a finger space between every word and end every statement sentence with a full stop.
- Encourage your child to use their Phonics when writing at home, helping them to listen carefully to the sounds that they can hear in each word and counting these sounds on their fingers before writing them down.

Maths

To help your child at home with their Maths this term, you could practise the following:

- Counting groups of objects in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.
- Recognising the symbols for multiplication and division.
- Solving simple multiplication and division calculations using objects from around the house and by drawing groups.
- Reading and writing numbers to 100.
- Discussing the number of tens and ones in numbers up to 100.
